Description

PHI is today an international academic network, launched at 2008 by UPM, in the topic of Latin American Heritage Preservation. It is focused on two objectives: amortization of academic and research capacities of its university members and the development of an advanced repository platform that aggregates and manages the results of mainly the Master Theses in the topic of Heritage Preservation in the Latin American region.

PHI is committed to educate in time and space by not only retrieving and deploying information coming from the academic world. It tries to exploit the role of the university as a "transmedia" vehicle for a dialogue among scholars, governments and citizens.

Latin America is one of the most urbanized regions in the developing world: in architecture, engineering, urban, archaeological and landscape. Therefore, it has been a perfect region for PHI to perform a test bed and to develop the project in an international scale. It started as a pilot project involving 8 universities from Spain, Portugal, Mexico, Brazil, Colombia, Peru, Argentina and Chile. Today, those founding universities are leading their national networks which are the actual members of PHI.

This workshop tries to present the current results of our international network and to give response to the increasing interest of some American universities which are involved in the preservation of the rich Hispanic Heritage at USA.

The workshop on Historic Heritage Preservation will consist of a Keynote Speech and two sessions:

KS. Harvard University

1. Activities of current PHI members in their National networks
2. Activities of potential PHI-USA members on Historic Heritage Preservation

A panel with final conclusions will end the day. In addition, it is expected that the interdisciplinary attendance to the workshop could help to retune their common research lines and open new opportunities for collaboration among the universities under the umbrella and promotion of RCC-Harvard.
